 - e.g. social unrest, social resistance and refusal against nuclear technology, revisiting energy policy, institutional reform, economic damages etc.
- How we should recognize implications of the cascading events and consequences?
- How we could deal with these emerging risks?

Common challenges in each country

- Social trust building
 - Transparency, Inclusive participation, Dialog & Consultation

- Enhancement of risk management for nuclear safety & security
 - Defense in depth, Resilience, Culture development

- Enhancement of organizational capability
 - Operating organization, Regulatory bodies

- Improvement of Governance for Utilization & Development of Nuclear Energy

Challenge in Asian region

- Regional nuclear cooperation scheme
 - Preparedness E.g. Convention on Supplementary Compensation for Nuclear Damage (CSC)
 - Emergency response & recovery
